

## Global Marketing and Philanthropy Interns Needed!

Do you have a passion for changing lives and building stronger communities with global impact through Hearing and Speech? Delta Zeta Sorority is looking for five members who are undergraduate students to join our philanthropy and service team as Global Marketing and Philanthropy Interns.

Delta Zeta's Global Marketing and Philanthropy Internship Program helps to support all aspects of the Sorority's focus on philanthropy and service. The internship program is ideal for candidates interested in direct service and a future career in marketing or non-profit administration. The internship program will provide motivated candidates the opportunity to gain insight into a fast-paced, non-profit organization while assisting with projects that are integral to the Sorority's philanthropic and community service success.

The Global Marketing/Philanthropy Interns will work under the direction of the Director of Community Relations and Philanthropy and the Chapter Operations team. The internship will take place from approximately January 9 to December 8, 2023.

Interns will commit to work around 8-10 hours per week. Interns will work remotely while offering peer-to-peer support to the Vice Presidents of Philanthropy. They will help chapters with philanthropy event planning, chapter fundraising, reporting, as well as provide education and awareness about our national philanthropy partnerships, Starkey Hearing Foundation, American Society for Deaf Children and SeriousFun Children's Network. Interns will work on marketing campaigns and help curate philanthropy and service focused content for social media and The LAMP. Interns will also help with national events (virtual and in person).

This position will receive a \$500 stipend at the conclusion of the internship and an opportunity to attend the 55th National Convention in Orlando, Florida July 27-30, 2023. Approved travel and business expenses will also be provided by the Sorority. Additionally, Global Marketing and Philanthropy Interns will have the opportunity to participate in a national or international philanthropy and service project.

Position Requirements: Candidates must be affiliated or enrolled in a verifiable program of study with a school or educational program/institution. Candidates are responsible for obtaining academic credit for the internship from their respective host institutions, if desired. Candidates must have valid passports and be willing to receive necessary vaccinations for international travel (if applicable).

We are also looking for members that possess:

- Exceptional organizational skills with strong attention to detail
- Excellent verbal and written communications skills
- Comfort in speaking in public to groups or via electronic media
- Excellent interpersonal skills and a passion to collaborate effectively
- Ability to manage multiple projects
- Ability and willingness to travel to assigned locations/sites as necessary
- Proficiency in Excel, Microsoft Word and social media platforms
- A commitment to Delta Zeta Sorority's core values
